**IHRA definition finally on track, but not without embarrassing Government carry-on**

The Hon Sarah Game MLC introduced a Motion to the SA Parliament on Wednesday 1<sup>st</sup> June 2022 to accept the International Holocaust Remembrance Alliance's definition of anti-Semitism. This same definition has previously been accepted interstate and Federally by both major parties.

However, the South Australian Labor Party, for inexplicable reasons, delayed and denied this Motion twice. Their insistence that the caucus had not had time to "properly consider" the Motion after two weeks' notice was a complete contradiction to the Government's modum operandum of attempting to rush sloppy legislation through the Upper House at their own whim.

The Minister for Tourism and Multicultural Affairs was totally unprepared to consider this Motion in the allocated fortnight. She had not bothered consulting anyone in the Jewish community. She had not reached out to Ms Game to accept a briefing on the Motion.

Multiple attempts to contact the Premier regarding this issues were ignored.

IHRA has been developed by world professionals and academics, but the Labor party's attempts to butcher the Motion with Amendments has been noted by the Jewish community. Now, the caucus says they are finally ready to vote "yes" on the Motion in full with no amendments. Will they follow through at tomorrow's vote?
